

Prophetic Proclamations, Declarations and Decrees

We're getting an upgrade in our understanding and expression of our authority in Christ.

Maturity: stop asking God for things He's already provided; stop asking Him to do things He's given us the responsibility to do.

We're gaining clarity on what is His job and what is ours, and how that Kingdom partnership looks

PSA 115:16 ¶ The heavens are the heavens of the Lord, But the earth He has given to the sons of men.

COL 1:27 to whom God willed to make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles, which is **Christ in you, the hope of glory.**

We must add this to our definition of glory.

Hope = a confident expectation based on revelation, that something good is coming my way

ROM 8:24 For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopes for what he already sees?

ROM 8:25 But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it.

Hope is inherently a prophetic function.

1CH 15:1 Now David built houses for himself in the city of David; and he prepared a place for the ark of God and pitched a tent for it.

1CH 15:2 Then David said, "No one is to carry the ark of God but the Levites; for the Lord chose them to carry the ark of God and to minister to Him forever."

1CH 15:3 And David assembled all Israel at Jerusalem to bring up the ark of the Lord to its place which he had prepared for it.

1CH 16:1 And they brought in the ark of God and placed it inside the tent which David had pitched for it, and they offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before God.

1CO 2:6 ¶ Yet we do speak wisdom among those who are mature; a wisdom, however, not of this age nor of the rulers of this age, who are passing away;

1CO 2:7 but we speak God's wisdom in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God predestined before the ages to our glory;

1CO 2:8 the wisdom which none of the rulers of this age has understood; for if they had understood it they would not have crucified the Lord of glory;

1CO 2:9 but just as it is written, "Things which eye has not seen and ear has not heard, And which have not entered the heart of man, All that God has prepared for those who love Him."

1CO 2:10 For to us God revealed them through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches all things, even the depths of God.

1CO 2:11 For who among men knows the thoughts of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so the thoughts of God no one knows except the Spirit of God.

1CO 2:12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God,

1CO 2:13 which things we also speak, not in words taught by human wisdom, but in those taught by the Spirit, combining spiritual thoughts with spiritual words.

1CO 2:14 ¶ But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually appraised.

1CO 2:15 But he who is spiritual appraises all things, yet he himself is appraised by no one.

1CO 2:16 For who has known the mind of the Lord, that he will instruct Him? But we have the mind of Christ.

ROM 8:18 ¶ For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. [eis = in, into]

ROM 8:19 For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God.

ROM 8:20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope

ROM 8:21 that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

ROM 8:22 For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now.

ROM 8:23 And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our body.

ROM 8:24 For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopes for what he already sees?

ROM 8:25 But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it.

2CO 1:20 For as many as are the promises of God, in Him they are yes; therefore also through Him is our Amen to the glory of God through us.

Notes from Invading the Seven Mountains with Intercession, by Tommi Femrite

Proclamation

An official announcement made verbally or in writing, about something that is important to the announcer. Examples: engagement, retirement, moving

(Information/Knowledge) We proclaim what God is doing or about to do.

LUK 2:10 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people;

LUK 2:11 for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

MAT 4:17 ¶ From that time Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

MAT 4:23 ¶ Jesus was going throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness among the people.

Declaration

An official pronouncement made verbally or in writing by a person with the delegated authority to do so. Examples: business closure, mortgage default

(Revelation) Verbal statement of agreement with what God has said or promised about us or a situation.

PRO 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue, And those who love it will eat its fruit.

ROM 10:8 But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" -- that is, the word of faith which we are preaching,

ROM 10:9 that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved;

ROM 10:10 for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation.

HEB 10:23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful;

Decree

A decree is an official order, edict, or decision, as of a church, government, court, etc. Decrees are written and officially establish the law. Examples: Bill signing, judicial decisions or orders, a king's recorded command

(Legislation) Whereas a proclamation is an announcement and a declaration is a pronouncement, a decree trumps them both as an official command. Every decree comes with the force of law behind it.

EST 1:19 "If it pleases the king, let a royal edict be issued by him and let it be written in the laws of Persia and Media so that it cannot be repealed, that Vashti may no longer come into the presence of King Ahasuerus, and let the king give her royal position to another who is more worthy than she.

EST 8:5 Then she said, "If it pleases the king and if I have found favor before him and the matter seems proper to the king and I am pleasing in his sight, let it be written to revoke the letters devised by Haman, the son of Hammedatha the Agagite, which he wrote to destroy the Jews who are in all the king's provinces.

EST 8:8 "Now you write to the Jews as you see fit, in the king's name, and seal it with the king's signet ring; for a decree which is written in the name of the king and sealed with the king's signet ring may not be revoked."

LUK 2:1 Now in those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus, that a census be taken of all the inhabited earth.

JER 1:9 Then the Lord stretched out His hand and touched my mouth, and the Lord said to me, "Behold, I have put My words in your mouth.

JER 1:10 "See, I have appointed you this day over the nations and over the kingdoms, To pluck up and to break down, To destroy and to overthrow, To build and to plant."

MAR 11:13 Seeing at a distance a fig tree in leaf, He went to see if perhaps He would find anything on it; and when He came to it, He found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs.

MAR 11:14 He said to it, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again!" And His disciples were listening.

JOH 12:31 "Now judgment is upon this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out.

Ekklesia = a gathering of citizens called out from their homes into some public place; an assembly; so used among the Greeks from Thucydides (cf. Herodotus 3, 142) down, an assembly of the people convened at the public place of council for the purpose of deliberating. (see Acts 19)

ISA 42:1 "Behold, My Servant, whom I uphold; My chosen one in whom My soul delights. I have put My Spirit upon Him; He will bring forth justice to the nations.

ISA 42:2 "He will not cry out or raise His voice, Nor make His voice heard in the street.

ISA 42:3 "A bruised reed He will not break And a dimly burning wick He will not extinguish; He will faithfully bring forth justice.

ISA 42:4 "He will not be disheartened or crushed Until He has established justice in the earth; And the coastlands will wait expectantly for His law."

ISA 51:15 "For I am the Lord your God, who stirs up the sea and its waves roar (the Lord of hosts is His name).

ISA 51:16 "I have put My words in your mouth and have covered you with the shadow of My hand, to establish the heavens, to found the earth, and to say to Zion, 'You are My people.'"

PSA 149:6 Let the high praises of God be in their mouth, And a two-edged sword in their hand,

PSA 149:7 To execute vengeance on the nations And punishment on the peoples,

PSA 149:8 To bind their kings with chains And their nobles with fetters of iron,

PSA 149:9 To execute on them the judgment written; This is an honor for all His godly ones. Praise the Lord!

MAT 6:10 'Your kingdom come. Your will be done, On earth as it is in heaven.

ACT 4:29 "And now, Lord, take note of their threats, and grant that Your bond-servants may speak Your word with all confidence,

ACT 4:30 while You extend Your hand to heal, and signs and wonders take place through the name of Your holy servant Jesus."

ACT 4:31 And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak the word of God with boldness.

1CO 5:3 ¶ For I, on my part, though absent in body but present in spirit, have already judged him who has so committed this, as though I were present.

1CO 5:4 In the name of our Lord Jesus, when you are assembled, and I with you in spirit, with the power of our Lord Jesus,

1CO 5:5 I have decided to deliver such a one to Satan for the destruction of his flesh, so that his spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus.

GEN 1:28 God blessed them; and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it; and rule over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the sky and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

Creation decrees!

JOB 22:27 "You will pray to Him, and He will hear you; And you will pay your vows.

JOB 22:28 "You will also decree a thing, and it will be established for you; And light will shine on your ways.
